

Reporting safeguarding concerns

Is the child in immediate danger or are they injured? If so, contact the emergency services first.



Report concern to Club/Regional Welfare Officer or Welsh Boxing Safeguarding Lead.



Welsh Boxing Safeguarding Lead to consult with case management group, Local Authority Children's Service, Police, LADO, or NSPCC helpline to determine next steps.



Record agreed actions, including who will notify parents/carers.



Lower- Level Concerns

Deal with concern using appropriate internal process.



Undertake investigation & hold disciplinary hearing.



Consider support requirements for those involved.



Possible outcomes:

- No case to answer
- Advice or warning given



Possible child abuse or criminality

Make referral to Children's Services, LADO, or police within 24 hours & record agreed actions.



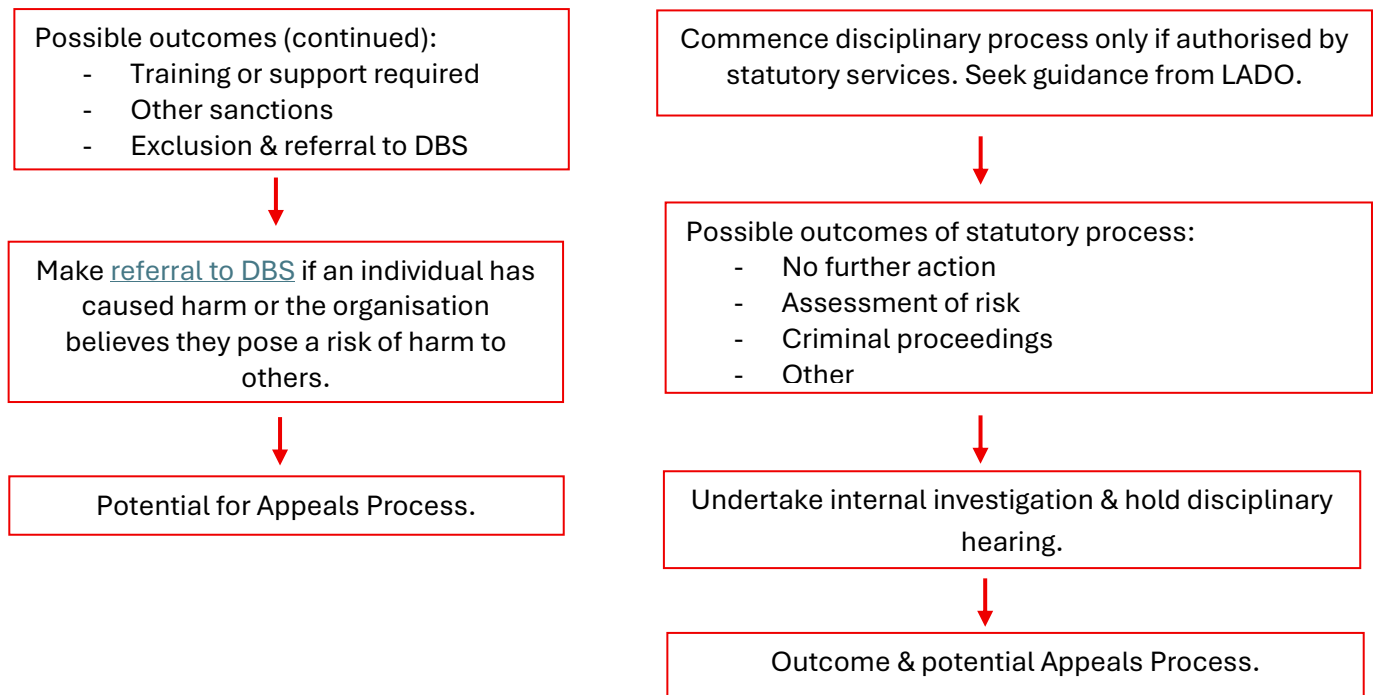
Consider support requirements for those involved.



Consult with statutory services/HR/Disciplinary Lead to determine:

- Disciplinary process
- Temporary/interim suspension
- Risk management
- Notifying others
